Bring and Brag

Another new year for Bring and Brag is beginning. Thanks again to all those who participated last year and to our Top Modelers from last year, Rich Cobb and Stewart Winstandley. This past Sunday the topic was food service cars and we had some very nice high quality entries along with one very nice submission for display only. Some really good modeling was evident. Good job guys.

For our topic of food service cars, Rick Cobb brought in a logging kitchen car that he made from wood that was cut to fit along with a combination of other materials. A real nicely made model with a good weathering job with the dry brush method. Brian Jones brought in a similar car which was a logging camp mess car in narrow gauge. Brian did a good job of assembling the kit and a great job of weathering the model. The model was enhanced by putting in on a track surrounded by a wealth of details. There were the On30 cooks, equipment found around a mess car, a dog, and a cat on the woodpile for example. Lots of detail. Bill Robbins entered a Diecast Union Pacific dinner that he had completely worked over on the inside to show the kitchen and dinners. Bill cut up an old AHM kitchen to use, then added chairs and tables and persons to sit on them. He made lamps from items from his wife's sewing and added tableware also. Bill did a very good job and showed what you can do with lots of effort and creativity.

Fred Plymale brought in another excellent model of a NYC dinner car showing the interior for display. Fred put in dining equipment, dinners, and even food on the plate. He mentions he saw a similar dinning car by MMR Joe Nichols, Sr. at a national show. If you go to the national NMRA show in Atlanta in 2013, you should go by and see his layout. Thanks again to Fred, and I am glad he brings his models so we can see them and what we can do if we work at it.

After all the voting slips were collected, I added all the numbers and calculated the results. It turned out that **Brian Jones** received the highest total at 26.2, while **Rick Cobb** had 22.7, and **Bill Robbins** received a score of 20.4. That was the order, but no matter the order, we saw models that anyone of us would be glad to have on our layout.

The topic for October's Bring and Brag is "Tips and Tricks". We will do a popular voting to decide the Bring and Brag points. So bring your favorite Tip or Trick to present and share and we can all learn something from them.
