## Tip from Randy Coffman

Manually uncoupling of rolling stock always seems to be a challenge for me. After an operating session one day I decided to look into the problem. Near the end of the day, almost by accident, I tried a very small, size #00 Phillips jewelers screwdriver, and the couplers almost jumped apart. I tested it on various cars with various manufacturers couplers and it seemed to consistently work.

The trick is to put just the tip right in the middle between the hooks on the knuckles and gently rotate clockwise. The spines on the tip gently rotate the hooks past each other and separate the couplers. If the tip is pushed too far into the couplers they jam on each other.

Larry: Yeah, that's true. They are all good guys, even if some of 'em have screwy ideas.


Rivets: Larry!
