## REFLECTIONS ON THE ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

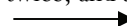
One of my responsibilities in Division 10 is to encourage all of our members to participate in the NMRA Achievement Program.

I have been a member of the NMRA off and on for at least 35 years. When I first learned of the program my immediate reaction was no way could I ever do that. It was for the real pros in the hobby. Hand lay track and scratch build turnouts (June meeting clinic) and a crossover? That was for people who had skills I would never have. Scratch build cars with brake rigging, separate grab irons and other details? That was way beyond me. My skills were limited to building Varney paper side cars and later those that came in Athearn blue boxes. Operation? I hardly knew what that was and it sounded pretty complicated. Scratch build and

detail structures? It was all I could do to put together a simple plastic kit without getting glue all over it. Weathering? That was for the artist types. Scenery? All I knew growing up was some cardboard buildings and a little plaster of paris here and there. I would see pictures of layouts with elaborate scenery and could only dream of such things.

But, you know what? I saw people in our group who had done it or were doing it. As I got to know members in our division, one of the greatest benefits of the club, it all became a little less mysterious. If others could do it, at least I could try.

I found that if you break a project down into small parts, it could be done: one grab iron at a time, one brake pipe or lever at a time, one rail or spike at a time, one board or piece of styrene at a time, one train at a time in scheduling operations. Anyone in our group could do those things once, twice, and as

many times as needed. The greatest benefit of the whole program is what you learn. You will find yourself doing things on your layout or equipment you have never done before, and that will give you more confidence to move on to the next project.

I made plenty of mistakes and had to do things over. I learned the challenge of working with small parts. If you are going to put on four grab irons you had better have eight on your workbench. You will drop some and never find them. One MMR at a convention called it "tweezers launch." I experienced a lot of that. Sometimes you use materials that are too thin or too thick and you have to try again. Colors don't always look as good as you think they will.

What judges will see are the finished products, not all the corrected mistakes along the way. By the way, judges are good people who want to see you succeed. To maintain integrity they use the NMRA point system. When they told me I had to do more work, the result was that my layout looked better.

Having MMR behind your name is a small consolation. The real benefit is what you learn in the process. Do what it takes to get those seven certificates and you will have a very satisfying sense of accomplishment plus a whole workbench of new and useful skills for model railroading.
