

NMRA Promoting Education & Training Program in MCR

The NMRA has charged Jim Six MMR to develop an Education and Training Program for the Mid Central Region. Merlyn Jarman shared this information with Committee chairs and Superintendents in the Mid-Central Region. Jim Six is the NMRA Education and Training Program Chairman. The materials are to be discussed with division and region board of directors. Training representative is to be selected at both the regional and division levels. The purpose of the Education Committee is to encourage model railroad hobbyists, whether members of the NMRA or not, to develop a greater set of knowledge, skills, and abilities that will lead them to a greater enjoyment, involvement, sense of pride and satisfaction and recognition of accomplishment, and just plain fun, through increased participation in our hobby. Guidelines include three broad areas: (1) Knowledge of prototype history and practice, of modeling basics, of accepted model railroading standards and best practices, and of resources available for modelers to improve their knowledge in those areas. (2) Skills, both conceptual and hands-on skills needed to design, build and operate a successful operating model railroad and its components. (3) Abilities for a modeler to properly integrate knowledge and skills to accomplish any of the tasks necessary to build a successful operating model railroad. Some of the principal methods available to meet Education Program goals involve providing available educational resources through the regional web page for region and division membership.



Above is another photo taken in Orville's basement. It is hard to see in the photo, but the locomotive to the left is standard gauge and the one lower right of center is an HOn3 narrow gauge Rio Grande K-27. Orville's is the first layout I've seen with dual gauge track. HOn3 is not N scale on an HO layout. The gauge of HOn3 is wider than N scale. N scale track could be used for HOn30. Orville also has a G scale Rio Grande Southern Galloping Goose #5. I'm currently trying to model RGS Goose #2 in Nn3 scale.

InterMountain Railway's ES44AC locomotives

InterMountain has a number of HO scale ES44AC locomotives in various railroad colors. They have included the Norfolk Southern's heritage units, other bygone railroads that never had this GE model, and one very interesting one, with the L&N's XR paint scheme. The L&N had one U30C XR locomotive #1499.

Tony Lucio, an ex-division 10 member, in researching the L&N's 1499 for *Model Railroad News*, he discovered some history that indicated they did not live up to GE's "eXtra Reliable" nickname. Tony emailed a number of us in October to get more information. I know a retired CSX employee who originally worked on the Monon, the L&N, etc. who was the engineer on a L&N train that moved this unit towards Corbin, Ky. where it was used in coal train service. His comment was "Later, as a supervisor, I had the chance to operate the U30C's in the coal fields, but as with all early GE power, I was not particularly impressed with them. They were rough riding and light footed, but they were an improvement over the U25B's that the L&N kept blessing the old Monon with."
