
Message From The Superintendent

A short break preceded an entertaining and practical *clinic* by John Burchnall on Foamboard Scenery construction, which included a video presentation

and a live demonstration, in addition to a presentation of a 2'x 4' example, and an available handout with all the details.

The formal meeting then ended at 4:00pm, and the layout tours to Wendell Greer and Joe Holbrook commenced. Each layout was worth the afternoon (and more) by itself. Wendell's is a basement HO scale, beautifully scenicked layout, with fascinating electrical and electronic details. Joe showed off two basement layouts, one in HO and one in O scale, plus a great wall collection of tin-plate, G-scale, and just about everything else you can imagine. Joe's layouts are also first-rate. His basement empire also includes a complete machine shop, which he has used quite effectively, including construction of a 1 1/2 inch scale engine and consist, also on display.
