



MEMBER PROFILES Bill Paulsell



Bill lives at 2269 Camberling Drive in Lexington with his wife, Sally. He grew up in "Big D" (Dallas), and is a graduate of TCU and Vanderbilt.

He began modeling at age 6 when he received a Marx set for Christmas. He graduated to Lionel, and began HO in junior high school, and worked at a Dallas hobby shop as a teenager.

Bill resumed model railroading after graduate school, and taught at Barton College in North Carolina for 19 years. He later served as Dean and President at Lexington Theological Seminary (1981-1992). He finished his career as Senior Minister of North Christian Church in Columbus, Indiana, 1992-1997, where he established a model railroad club. He returned to Lexington in 1998 upon retirement.

He joined the Bluegrass Railroad Club during his first Lexington stay, and has been a current member since his return.

Bill has an 18 X 10 HO layout currently, as well as a small Lionel layout "for his grandchildren," Amanda and Theo. The HO layout is controlled by Digitrax DCC. The primary interest is in Norfolk & Southern, which began as an interest in Southern. The layout is called the Lexington, Tennessee and Southern (LTS). It's motto is "Usually on Time."

His current big project is a garden road, displayed on a recent NMRA tour.
