
We will continue our mission


Brass from Fred Welch's collection is for sale on E-Bay by "freddde" - Fred Plymale, with a percentage of the proceeds going to the Division.

# MEMBER PROFILES Thomas Bookout



Thomas lives at 3369 Boston Road, Lexington, KY. He graduated in the class of 2000 from Lafayette Senior High School. He is currently attending Bridgewater College in Bridgewater, VA near Harrisonburg, with plans to transfer to Centre College in Danville, KY. He is majoring in chemistry.

Thomas was born in Huntington, WV; and lived also in Greenwood, SC, where he saw plenty of Southern Ry. equipment on the newly formed Norfolk Southern, as well as trains on the SCL.

His favorite train watching memory from SC is the caboose on the end of every train (they were one of the last states to repeal the caboose law). When he was four he moved to Buckhannon, WV, where he got to see the end of the caboose era on the Chessie/CSX. He received his first train set, a Lionel, for Christmas when he was six years old, and at eight he extended his modeling interests into HO scale, but he still has his first Lionel to this day.

Shortly after moving to Lexington in 1989, his the neighbor, late J.R. "Bob" Ford Jr., introduced him to the Bluegrass Railroad Club. After joining the club, he got into N scale, which is now his primary modeling scale: but he also has Lionel (MTH), a modest collection of HO, American Flyer S, and one G-gauge train. He has an N-TRACK module, which has been used for the past three years the Kentucky Horse at Park's Southern Lights show. and was recently shown in Somerset.

He has an 0 gauge layout under construction, and an N scale layout in the planning stage.

He models primarily the

B&O and the C&O in N scale; and whatever he wants in the other scales (mostly Southeastern roads). His preferred era is the steam to diesel transition, but occasionally he will bend that rule.

Other organizations that Thomas belongs to are the Bluegrass Railroad Club, Bluegrass Railroad Museum, Kentucky Railway Museum. Lionel Railroaders Club, and the TAMR. He is a Conductor and Student Engineer at the RR Museums. He has recently been heading a project at BGRM to restore a (you guessed it - Southern Railway )bay window caboose to its former bright red color. He wishes the best of luck for Division 10 and hopes to be a part of its success.

Thomas supports cooperation with other organizations in the area to promote the preservation of railroad history through modeling, education and restoration.

Thomas is a real asset to the Division, and we all wish him well in his new academic endeavors.

Larry: But what will people think when they see how much I haven't done, Rivets?


Rivets: They'll think they're not the only ones in the same boat, Larry. We've all got more projects than we have time or money for.
