


I look forward to hosting the March tour, as sort of a followup to the clinic, so you can see (Continued on page 2)

## **Southern Railway 4610**

These pictures were taken in Lawrenceburg in February, 2001 by one of the members of the Bluegrass Railroad Museum.

The 4610 is a GP59, and is the only engine on the Norfolk Southern active roster that is still maintained in a retired paint scheme and still referred to by a retired name.

It is gone from Lawrenceburg now, on another assignment.
