# MEMBER PROFILES John Lathrop



John and Bev, along with son John and daughter Kacey live at 1705 Fox Head Court in Lexington. He has worked at the University of Kentucky for 26 years and lived in Lexington for almost that long. His last layout was torn down after deciding to move to a bigger house with a basement. The old layout was Lionel and took up the entire garage.

He has plans to build an N-scale layout based on the C&O's New River area. If all goes well it will be up and running in the next five years.

Growing up in Harrodsburg next to the Louisville main line, he became a big fan of the Southern Railroad. As a child he would sit on the front porch swing, watching as the freight trains rolled along the tracks. His oldest brother had an 027 layout on a 4 X 8 piece of plywood, one steam engine and a few cars; from that point he was hooked. His first train set was an American Flyer, bought as a teenager and he has been collecting and watching trains ever since.
