

## **DIVISION 10 ELECTIONS BALLOT**

**DIVISION 10 OFFICER ELECTIONS:** It's time for elections for officers for Division 10. Officers are elected for two-year terms. Wendell Greer has chaired the nominations committee, but no nominations have been forthcoming. The Officer slate sketches appear below, along with a ballot, which should be returned to Wendell by September 15th.

**For Superintendent**: Bill Robbins is an active member of both the NMRA Div 10 and The Bluegrass RR Club. He is also active in the Tuesday night group, and hosts an Operations Session every other month on his home HO scale layout. He has converted it from a "Switch List" to a Card Order system, and is planning on migrating to DCC control. His plans as Superintendent include: Development of a program to encourage the construction of new home layouts and the improvement of existing ones; Informing members and teaching them in the latest modeling techniques and Supporting those activities in which all members will want to take an active role.

**For Assistant Superintendent:** Mike Armstrong has served for the past year as Treasurer, and has also chaired the Company Store and Estate Auctions committees. He is probably the most "cosmopolitan" member of the officer slate, involved in N, HO, O and G, and in outreach programs to youth. His plans for the future include involvement in shows, expansion of outreach activities, and generally lending his enthusiastic support for all of the Division 10 activities and initiatives.

**For Secretary**: John Gorman has been an active and enthusiastic member of Division 10, and has served as photographer, providing photos for the Lantern and the web site. He's also been active in the Tuesday night group, and in the new HO modular SIG. In addition to Secretary, he plans to serve also as Newsletter Editor and Webmaster. He plans on maintaining high standards for the publications, and adding some new features, such as product reviews, or member-submitted features.

**For Treasurer**: Fred Plymale has served for the past three years as Division 10 Superintendent, and informally as Advertising and Program Chairman. He was the driving force behind re-instituting the Division, and has been tireless in all the efforts necessary to ensure a firm grounding. He has been active in the Tuesday night group, the N-scale SIG, and in the new HO Modular SIG. His plans for the next two years include continuing his high level of involvement in many aspects of the Division, including possibly a show.



# MEMBER PROFILES Fritz Dutro



Fritz's layout in HO models a fictitious extension of the Wheeling and Lake Erie Railroad from Zanesville to Corning, Ohio in 1928. Since he loves small steam locomotives, this gives him a great opportunity to buy lots of new Spectrum 2-8-0's. He also has this strange idea of electrifying the right of way. He's bought lots MDC Boxcabs and pantographs, and now is trying to figure out the catenary.

Fritz is married, with one son who will graduate from high school in the spring of 2003. 
