There is a great interest in 50lc3. I used Division 8's application to apply for our club.


Most of the clubs seem to be in process or have built module layouts which can be used for display purposes at various locations. Several clubs sell freight cars, structures, etc. to raise money.

***** Don't Miss the MCR Div. 10 OHIO TOUR *****

This month Division 10 members have the opportunity to tour several established club layouts and a working prototype steam railroad in east central Ohio. The tour will be on March 28 and 29 Members will be responsible for their own transportation and lodging, a rate will be secured at a national chain motel for those who are interested. The tour will start at 3:30 on the 28th in Coshocton and will wrap up after 2:00 PM in Zanesville. The drive to Coshocton is approximately 280 miles.

Members will have the opportunity to tour the Coshocton, Cambridge and Zanesville Model Railroad Clubs. All three clubs have permanent layouts and are sized between 2400 and 7500 square feet. Details on each club will be provided at the March NMRA meeting.

In addition we will be touring the Ohio Central Steam Shop (ocsteam.com) where we will see at least 8 steam locomotives and several first generation diesels. This is a working shop that rebuilds steamers and diesels. Check out the website for more information.

A Cambridge member has invited us to tour his caboose collection. Currently they are restoring 5 Pennsy, B&O, and C&O cabooses.

I will be providing a handout with details of each of the layouts and the prototype tours at the March meeting. If you cannot attend the meeting contact me and I will provide you a copy of the handout. I am asking for a pre-registration so that I can let our hosts know how many people will be in our group.

I look forward to seeing you at the meeting and again in the hills of Eastern Ohio on the 28th.
