the 2002-2003 fiscal year. Just how far in the black remains to be seen since the reports aren't finished yet, but this is the first time in at least eight years that we were able to accomplish this. What makes this feat even more remarkable is that it was accomplished in a year when our biggest income producers, the national convention and train show, fell far short of expectations for income. The officers and staff, as well as the many volunteers, are to be commended for finally getting our financial ship turned around and on a new course.

Second, the new regulations, intended to replace the old constitution and by-laws, are finally finished and ready for the ballot. Anyone who wants to read them will find them on the National website, **www.nmra.org**, or can receive them by phoning the home office and asking for a printed copy (there's some postage involved, but I don't know how much), or I can e-mail you a PDF file if you send me an e-mail request.

In addition, Charlie Getz has written a two-part Q&A article for the Bulletin, and I can send you that as a Word file if you request it. The Q&A article answers many, but not all, of the many questions members are asking about how the new regulations and the LRP will be implemented if they are approved by the membership on the next ballot.

As I have said many times, I'm sure that no one is completely happy with every provision in the new regulations, but I think they represent our best chance for making the NMRA more relevant to the hobby and improving our long-term survivability. In addition, the new regulations help to bring all levels of the NMRA closer together, while still preserving the autonomy and viability of the regions and their divisions. I am excited by the possibilities they represent, and I urge every member to approve them when the ballot comes early next year.

Well, that's all I have for you this time. As always, I am available to you by e-mail, mail, and phone. My numbers are on the masthead of the *KingPin*. Feel free to write or call, whether about the new regulations or any other subject of concern. I'll be happy to hear from you.



#### **Open Letter to the Division 10 Members**

But what about the rest of you?

I realize that things do happen which precludes one from attending a meeting but we have had sparse attendance for many months. Like I said earlier we welcome any suggestions from the membership in order to turn this situation around.
