Notes from Fritz (Continued from page 1) of pontificating) as to how to get more enjoyment out of your hobby year round.

There has been a tremendous amount of temptation to those of us modeling the steam era recently because of the new offerings from Life-like, Broadway Limited, Spectrum, and other manufacturers (and I am sure the diesel guys know all about it also with p2k, genesis and others). It seems that there is no lack of items competing for your hobby dollars including all that new ready to run stuff. A trip to the hobby shop can certainly test your restraint.

I am certainly not immune to the new stuff and the new Spectrum 4-6-0 that sits on my workbench is testament to that. Fortunately for me and my hobby budget I found a way to combat these urges years ago. I found that by dating my railroad to a certain time (1928) and place (southeast Ohio) and setting certain restrictions on rolling stock (nothing larger than a 2-8-0, no freight cars longer than 40' and little or no passenger equipment) I have been cured of both of my hobby problems, gotta-haveit-itis and one-of-everythingosis. Whenever I go into a store or look through the magazine or catalog the first thing I ask when confronted with the latest and greatest offering is "Will this fit into the parameters I have set for my layout?" If the answer is no it becomes an easy pass for me. If it is yes then I've got to figure out a way to sneak it into the house.

One of the niceties of placing restrictions on yourself is that it keeps the number of rectangular storage dust collectors (unbuilt kit boxes) from taking up too much space in the basement (more on that next month).

So the next time you see me at the hobby store not buying much be mindful that it's not that I'm cheap, I'm just looking for the right kit.

This month we will see Pete Birdsong's N Scale Chesapeake & McKenna Ridge Railroad. We will be treated to a demonstration of Model Railroad Operations as done all over the US. Pete also has an On30 railroad under construction. It will be featured in another issue of the Lantern.

Style: Loop to Loop with Single Track Main

Benchwork: Luan over L-girder frames and joists

Roadbed: Cork

Mainline: 150 Feet

Control: Digitrax Radio Super Chief

Roster: 12 Modern Diesels and 6 Older Diesels. All with DCC Decoders

Signals: Computer Controlled by Dispatcher

"Prototype History":

The C&MR was formed as a joint venture of the Chessie, L&N and Southern lines in post-Chessie 1973, with Headquarters in Sinclair, KY, operating as a belt line serving Lexington industries, with trackage rights with the parent companies, serving Chesapeake, KY, on the Ohio River, and McKenna Ridge, KY, with connections to Knoxville. It was reabsorbed into Norfolk Southern in 1995.

Model History:

The C&MR began life as an N-scale 4' x 8' layout in Gaithersburg, Maryland, over 15 years ago. It was moved to Lexington, KY about 13 years ago, and has been through several expansions, growing to about 3 ½ by 45 feet in several additions, the latest of which is still not scenicked. It supports operations sessions, along with another Lexington layout, for 6 to 10 "regulars" in MCR Division 10. The plan is (big) loop to (little) loop with a single track main. Control is via Digitrax Radio Super Chief. Construction is luan over L-girder frames and joists. Operations are run in fast time and managed by computer programs for switchlist generation and scheduling. Decoder programming is mostly by Winchief.

"CEO":

Pete Birdsong began modeling as a kid, and was into planes, boats, and cars as well as model railroads. Like most, he abandoned all the hobbies in his teens. He started up again when his wife gave him a set for Christmas. He is now retired after 38 years with IBM and Lexmark, and has served in several offices in the MCR and Division 10
