# Notes From Fritz

My friendly editor John Gorman told me that last month's column didn't generate too many letters to the editor in protest and because of that, I get to write another article (i.e.: fill several more column inches). Kind of reminds me of a contest I saw once with first prize being one week in Toledo and second prize was two weeks.

Last month I wrote about the importance of focus when it comes to modeling. Focus does not mean limiting your scope anymore than accepting other restrictions inherent to model railroading such as it is not very realistic running that new big boy on 15 inch radius curves in HO. What focus does is allow you to more plausibly use your equipment in a more realistic (and reliable) setting.

So now that you have bought into all this stuff, we move onto the next stage of my nine step program, (this should make John happy that I'm probably committing myself to seven more columns). You've gone through all of your kits and rolling stock and you are satisfied that you've attained a consistent look for your railroad. The ground rules are that only NMRA members may run trains. All visitors and guests are welcome, but to run trains, you must be a NMRA member. We cannot make any exceptions. The main running times will be Saturday and Sunday from Noon to 4:00 pm. If you are not into N scale, don't worry, there is plenty of equipment to run. The layout is on the end of the Turfland Mall next to Home Depot.




December - Open Loads: Flat Cars, Gondolas and Intermodal


Next month we have a new category – "Infrastructure: Trackwork, Signals and Bridges". So pack up your entries for

everything built. The sheer amount of unbuilt stuff is so daunting that it becomes hard to build anything, or super detail it, weather it, put in the interior, and light it. After all, the photos in the magazine all show completed layouts with lots and lots of details.


Well, it looks like you've run into the problem of inertia, defined as "an unbuilt kit willing remain unbuilt until vou sell it at a train show where it will continue to be unbuilt by its' new owner." As such, I am proposing a radical new idea to increase your modeling pleasure; it's called "Build a kit Month".
