



Trustee's Message

The 2005 Seattle convention ended Sunday, July 11, and my deadline for writing my report to you is Monday, the 12^{th} . I know you'll forgive me if this report is shorter than it ought to be.

This is the last time I'll be writing to you as MCR Trustee. I was installed on Friday morning as NMRA vice president, along with our new president, John Roberts. As one of his first acts, John appointed Miles Hale as the new MCR trustee. Miles was recommended to succeed me by the MCR BOD. Congratulations to Miles and John, two MCR boys made good. I know that Miles will receive the same kind of cooperation and support that I have enjoyed over the last 11 years.

The new Regulations passed by more than a four-to-one margin, and will be phased in over the next 13 months. It is our plan to have them implemented fully by September 1, 2005.

The new board of directors will be elected in the winter of 2005, and will be seated at the 2005 National Convention in Cincinnati. Details on the nomination and election process will appear shortly. Eric DerVinis, the MER trustee, is the chair of the new nominating committee, so if you are interested in running or in nominating someone, contact Eric at <u>mert@hq.nmra.org</u> for more information. Details should also be appearing soon on the NMRA website and in **Scale Rails**.

The new single membership policy cannot be accomplished without a total revamping of the NMRA's membership database and computer system, something that I have been trying to accomplish since the early 1990s. President Roberts has appointed me to chair the Database Steering Committee, and I have asked treasurer Tom Draper and new secretary Dave Liesse to work on the committee with me. Our goal is to have the new system up and running before the 9-1-05 conversion to single membership. Some of you will be hearing from the committee as we establish the requirements for the new system over the next few months.

The non-US trustees, working as the International Committee, have developed an intriguing new proposal that would allow NMRA members in Canada, Australia, and Great Britain to receive office services within their own countries. Early estimates indicate that tremendous savings can be realized by servicing these members in their own countries, and we hope that a reduction in costs will result in a lowering of dues in those areas. This flexibility is one of the reasons the new regulations were needed, and it looks as if they will quickly bear fruit in many areas.

The three trustees who also serve as region presidents have been asked to get the Regional Advisory Council up and running. Head of this organizational group is Bob Gangwish, the SSR president and trustee. After getting organized, their first tasks will be to set the region portion of the national dues for single membership and to elect the RAC Director to the new Board of Directors. Howard Smith should hear from them shortly as they get up and running.

Bob Dye has retired after nine years as national secretary. This is a big job and has been ably handled by Bob. His replacement, Dave Liesse of the MWR, has been assistant secretary for many years and has already proven his aptitude for the responsibility.

Treasurer Tom Draper reported that the NMRA will end its fiscal year in the black for the second year in a row. This is good news indeed, and indicates that we really have turned the corner financially. Thanks to Tom, Bob, Allen Pollock, John Roberts, Office Manager Jenny Hendricks, Library Manager Brent Lambert, and all the employees and volunteers across the world who have worked so hard to make this turnaround possible.

As I leave the role of trustee, I want to say thanks to the many people who have made my job meaningful and enjoyable over the past 11 years. I know Judy doesn't have room for a list that long, so I won't even try, even though the names are rolling through my memory as I write this.

I have been either a volunteer or an officer in the MCR for about 30 years, and I have met most of my best friends through the NMRA. I have been privileged to spend time with a lot of dedicated, helpful, friendly, and knowledgeable people, and I treasure every memory I have of our work and play together. I know that you will continue to help and support me, the MCR, and the NMRA as I take on this sobering new responsibility. Thanks for the past, the present, and our futures together. I don't know how there could be a better region, or a better group of friends, in the entire NMRA.
