First, Don Burris brought a Santa Fe 0-6-0 switcher. Next, Michael Tyra entered one of the most unusual kitbashes we've seen - an ALCo FP 636 AB set. This model was so well done one that many wouldn't have realized it was a kitbash! It was painted in an ALCo factory demonstrator scheme and was based on a proposed locomotive that never got past the drawing board. It was hard not to imagine this beast working for the L&N in eastern Kentucky! Lou Jaquith brought a super looking USA Trains G scale GP9 painted in his Paducah & Louisville colors, David Oswald shared a Pennsy Mantua 0-4-0, and Ed Graves rounded things out with a sharp L&N GP7 painted in L&N's gray and yellow scheme.

Michael's FP 636 took first place, Lou's GP9 came in second, and Ed's GP7 came in third. Michael, congratulations on a real show stopper!

In photos, Ron Kercheval entered a shot of L&N's famed 4-6-2 No. 152 taken at night in its shed, and Lou Jaquith shared a nice enlargement of a P&L train headed by a GP10 and a GP35. Ron's night shot took first place.
