#### LIFE IMITATES ART!

A little over 20 years ago, April, 1986 to be exact, I discovered the Illinois Central was selling their Kentucky Division to two western Kentucky businessmen. Since my Paducah and Louisville Railroad was based on the line they were buying, I decided, on a lark, to write and suggest they name it after my model railroad and included a short synopsis of my line, color scheme, and my logo.

They had already chosen another name based on family hometown locations, but the initials they came up with, CG&T, were already in use by a Canadian railroad and could not be used. My letter, fortunately, arrived at the time they were looking for another name. Within a week, one of the owners called me and suggested I come talk to them.

I went to Paducah with pictures, diagrams, and models. They liked what I brought and adopted my color scheme, road name, and logo exactly as I had designed it. The only difference was they became P & L Railway and I'm P & L Railroad.

Since then I've had a great relationship with the line through several owners, have ridden their special trains, freight trains, and even had my own trip in their private cars. I've painted over 300 sets of display models for P & L and VMV Rebuilding Shops in Paducah for retirees and company presidents. My models have gone all over the world from England to Mexico. I'll be attending the 20th anniversary celebration as an employee - I've been an umpaid employee of theirs since August, 1986, when they started up, although they do pay me adequately for the models.




