Bring and Brag

Wow! We had more models for the February meeting than we had for our previous high total at the meeting in December. There were nine entries of model structures to be judged this time. What a turnout! I wish to thank the gentlemen and the lady who brought the models for all of us to admire and judge. Bill Paulsell brought in two good looking scratchbuilt structures; one, a Railroad Express building and secondly, a freight house. Done Burris brought in a two-level house one might see in a subdivision, and Tom Krill had a passenger/freight station made from a Vollmer kit initially. Yours truly brought in a Pikeville engine house kit that I added a porch to along with some other details. Lou Jaquith brought in a beautiful model of a station that he kitbashed and combined from different kits to make the model of the station he wanted. Good job. Stew Winstandley brought a well done kit model of a lineside tool house in Z scale. Stewart did not supply a magnifying glass to look at his model, but I know I would have to have one to build such a kit. Ray Grosser had an O scale model of a coaling facility that he built from plans. Someone said if you looked into the back of the model you could see an O scale man shoveling real O scale coal. Renee Grosser brought an O scale model of a 1940's style house in Minnesota which now resides where she used to play as a young girl. Very nice job. I hear we will visit the Grosser's again in September. If you have never visited them, please do yourself a favor and go on the layout tour to the Grosser's. They are great modelers and great hosts. I hope I faithfully described everyone's model correctly.

Again, I would also like to thank all of our members who took the time and effort to judge and score the models. After the scored sheets were collected, the averages for the three categories of (1) Construction, (2) Detailing, and (3) Finish & Lettering were computed and then summed to create a grand total for each model. The lady, Renee Grosser, received the highest grand total of 27.6. Close behind was her husband Ray with 27.2 for the coaling facility. The two models from Bill Paulsell were slightly behind with scores of 25.3 and 25.2. Lou Jaquith was next in scoring with 22.3 for his station, followed by Stew Winstandley with 20.8. Next up was yours truly with 17.2, just slightly ahead of Tom Krill with 16.6. The house from Don Burris scored 12.8.
