## THIRD ANNUAL DIORAMA CONTEST

By all measurements this year's diorama contest was a great success. In my opinion everyone who entered was a winner. They actually built something and tried new modeling techniques and also improved their existing skills. Since our first "hands on" clinic several years ago and our annual diorama contests the level of modeling by Division 10 members has significantly improved. Animation (the use of people), water, weathering, detail and overall design were excellent this year. Scratch building also played a very important part in judging the best dioramas. There were only 3 points between 1<sup>st</sup> and second place and 7 points between 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

First place went to Rick Cobb with a total of 83 points out of 100. Rick is relatively new to model railroading but those of you who have seen his built collection of model cars can understand why he will be an excellent model railroader too.

Second place went to Bill Paulsell with a total of 80 points. Bill's weathering and overall design was especially good and he is well on his way to becoming a Master Model Railroader. Keep it up Bill!

Third place went to Bob Ferguson with a total of 76 points for his "Neighborhood". Bob would have placed much higher if he had earned any scratch building points. His "Moonshine Manor" was also an outstanding diorama that would have placed higher with scratch building points.

Stew Winstandley entered a very good Z-scale diorama with good hills and use of water. His construction and details were outstanding as was the overall design.

Bill Robbins had a large diorama built mostly from DPM modules that unfortunately doesn't qualify as scratch built. Lots of people and vehicles did well in the detail category.

Pete had the most unique diorama of all. He built a T-scale operating railroad in a very small portable case. He was handicapped by the age of the judge's eyes and our lack of a magnifying glass. It was a great effort and very unique.


